
Derrick Ong 王偉良

Derrick is also recognized as a Fujifilm X-Photographer (Ambassador) and a Brilliant Prints Ambassador, further highlighting his influence and excellence in the field.





His interest rekindled during the COVID years and during the lockdown, he started to take photos of clouds daily for 2 years with his smartphone.


